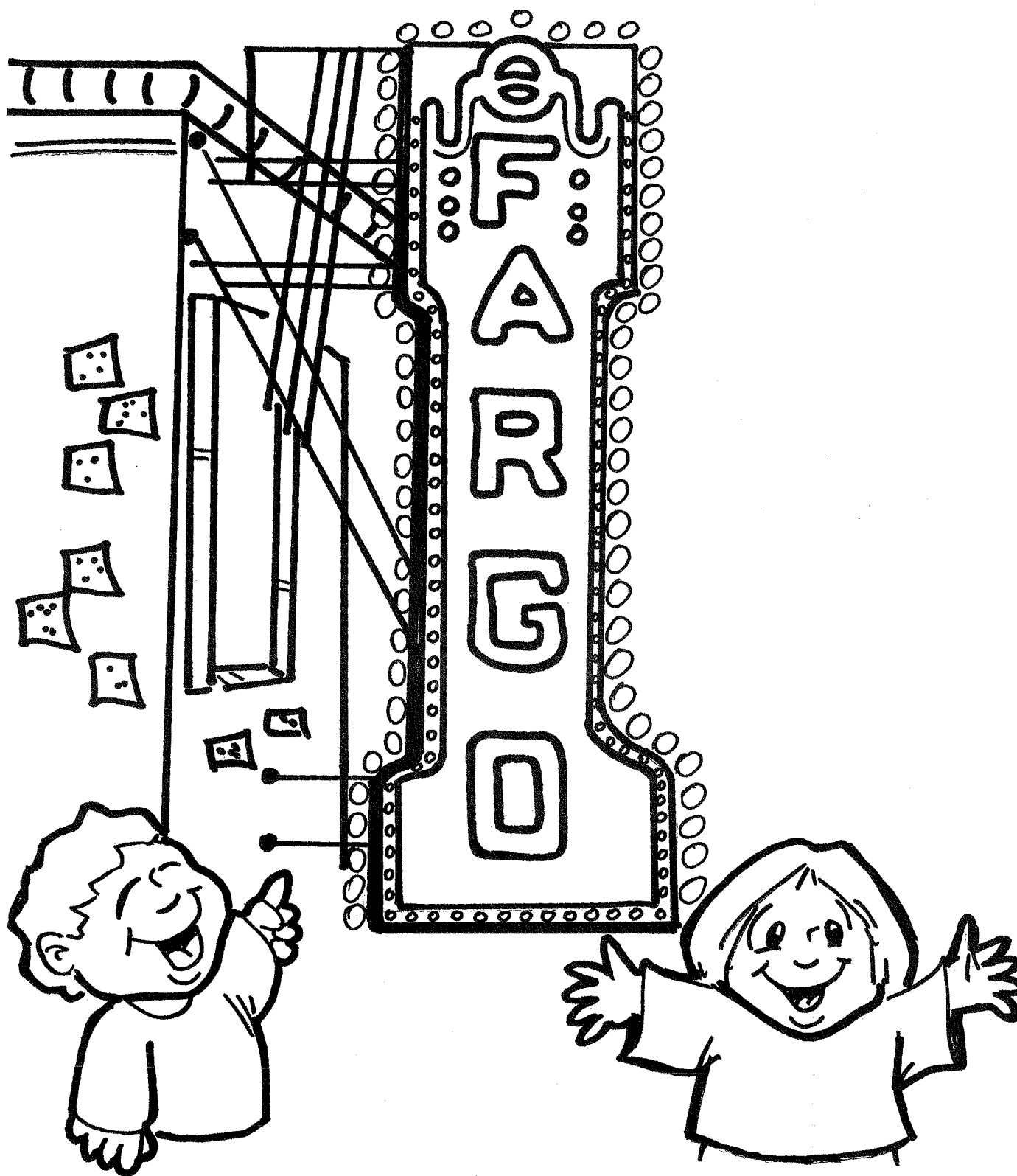

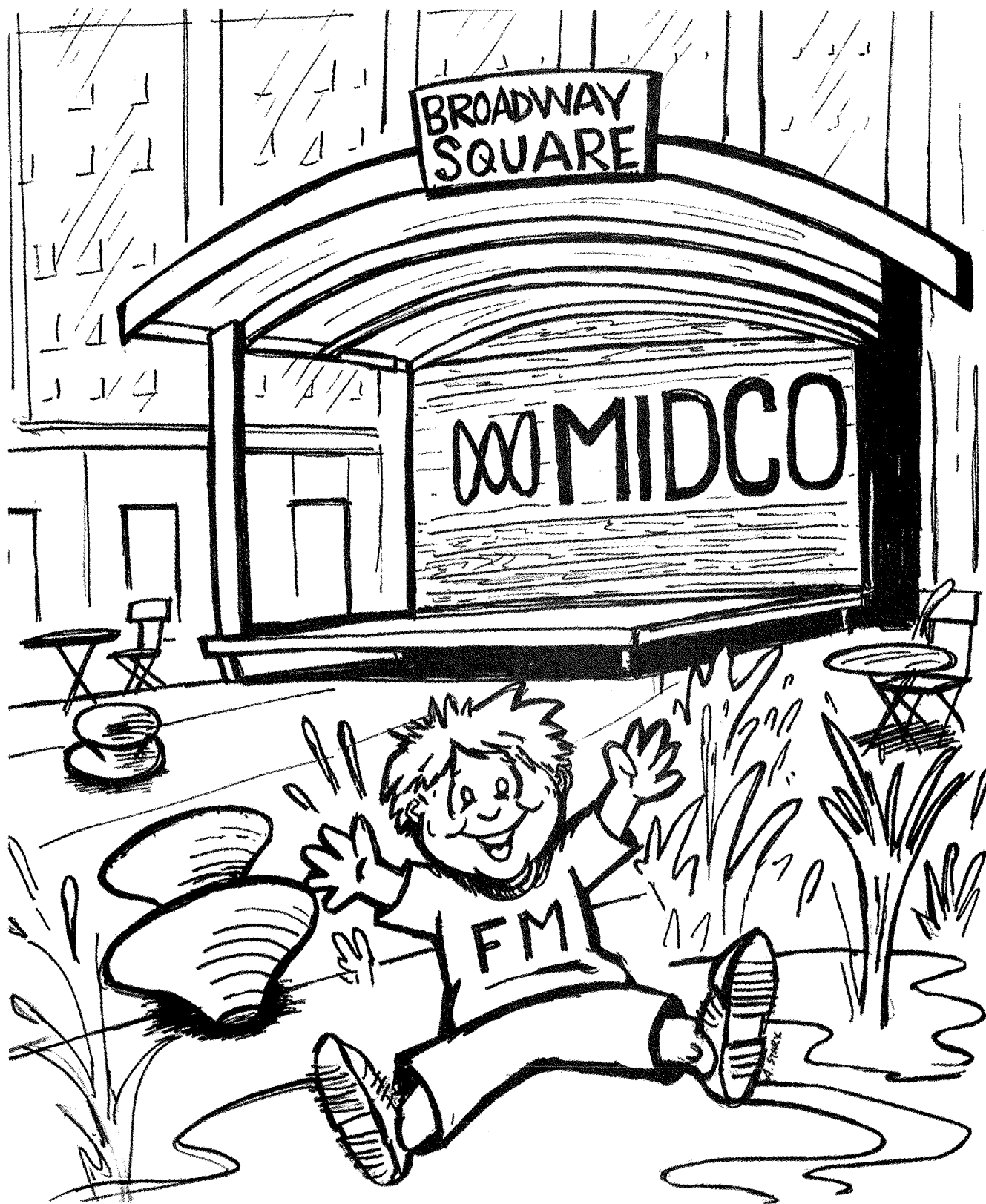
The Red River runs between Fargo, North Dakota and Moorhead, Minnesota.

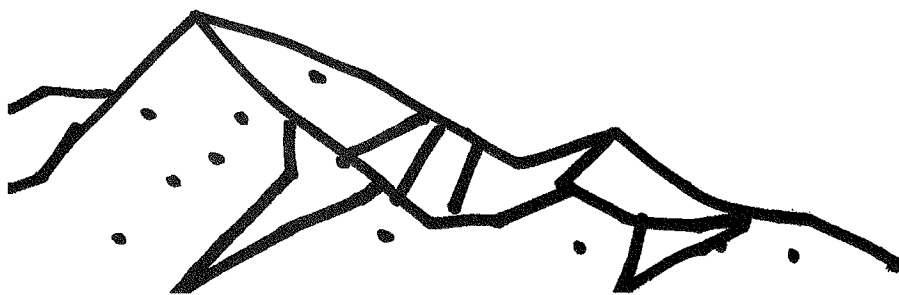

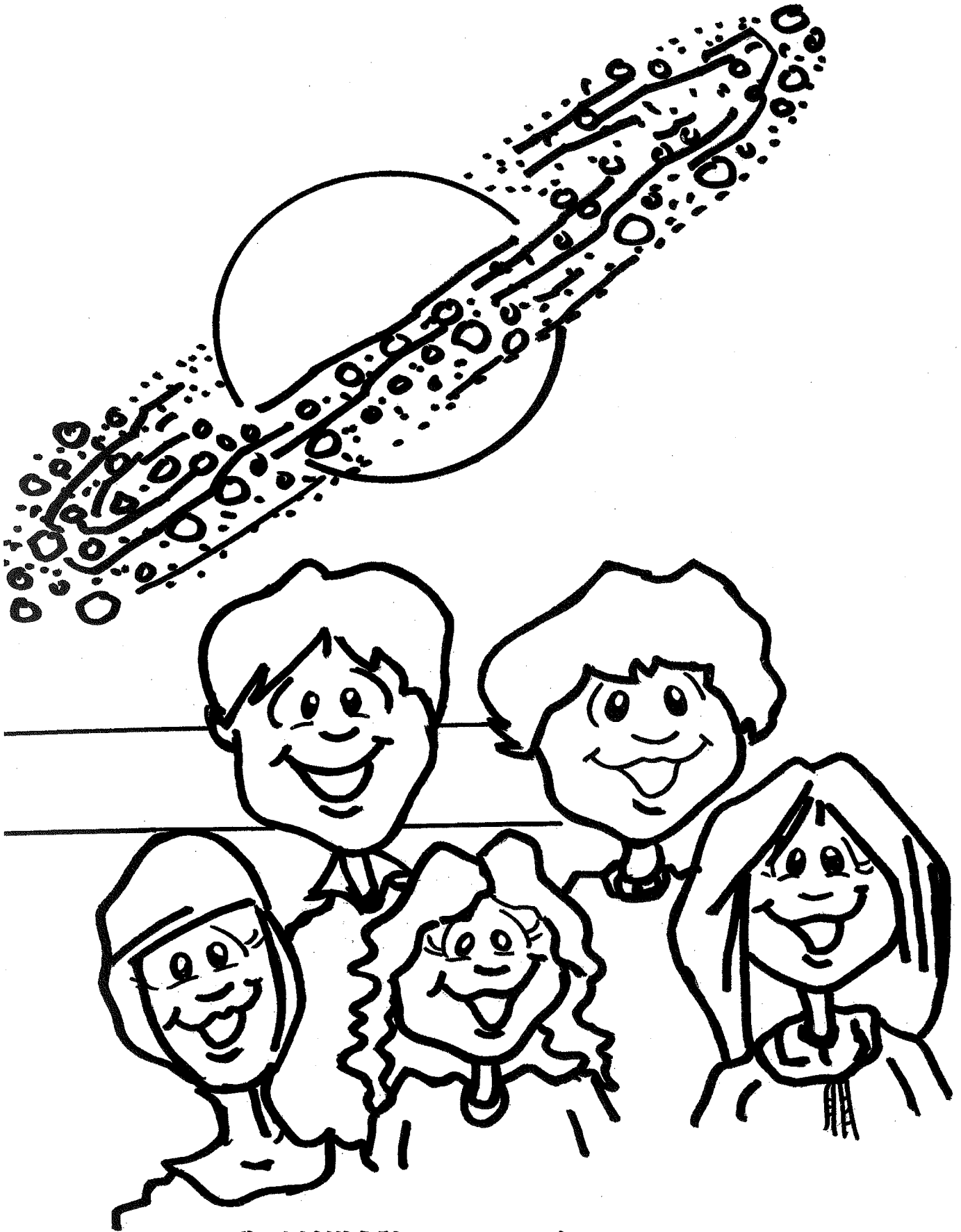

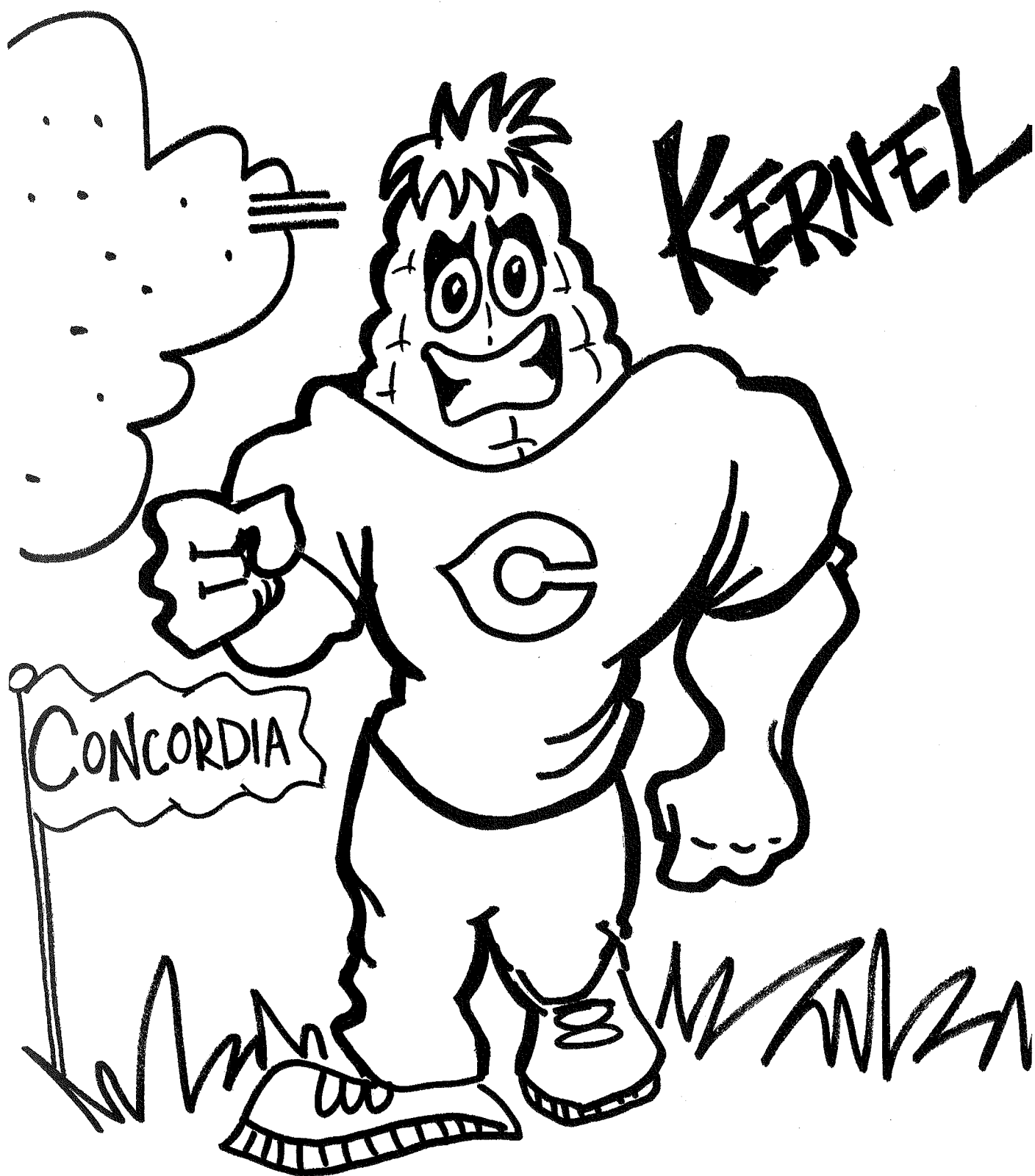

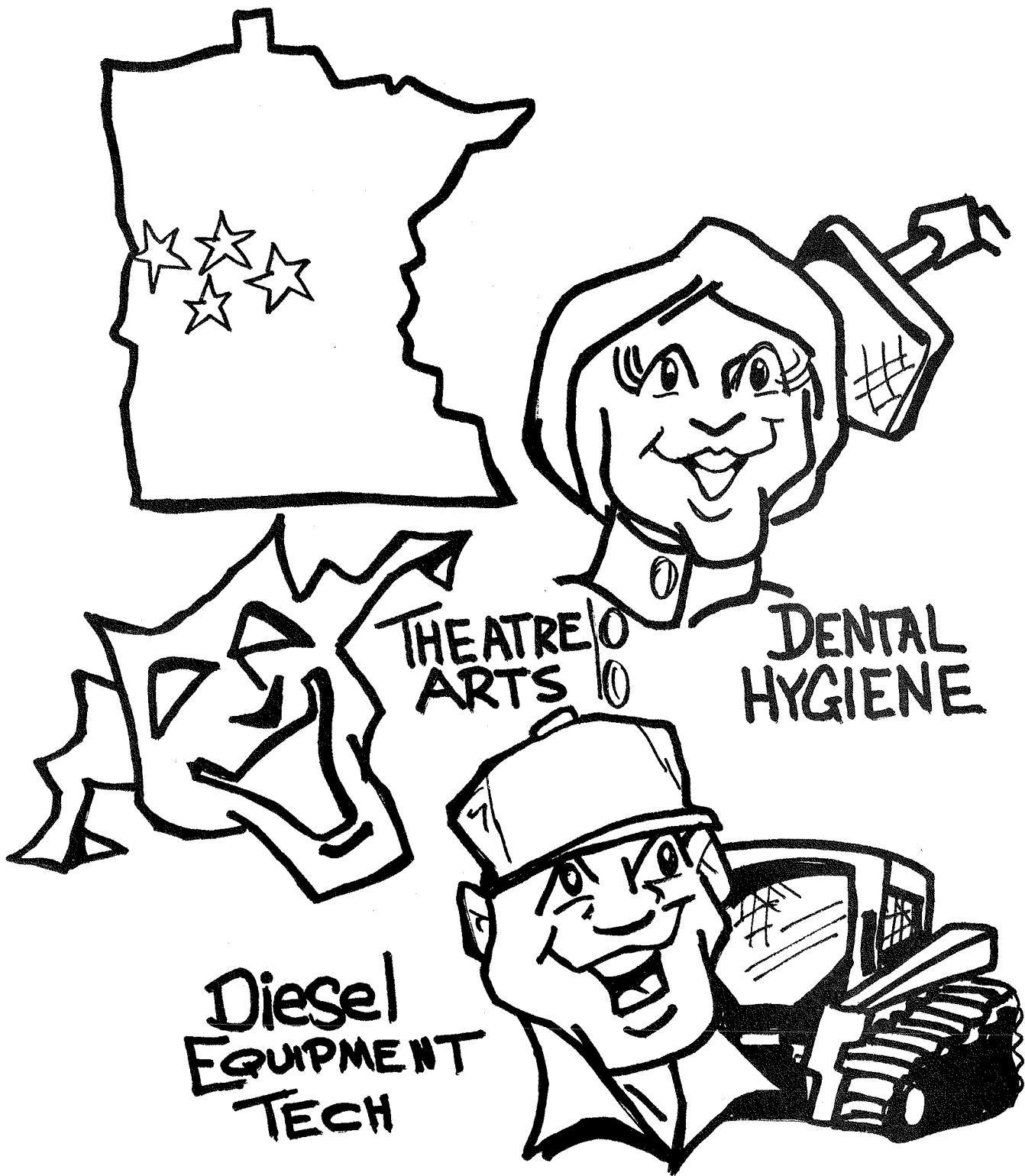

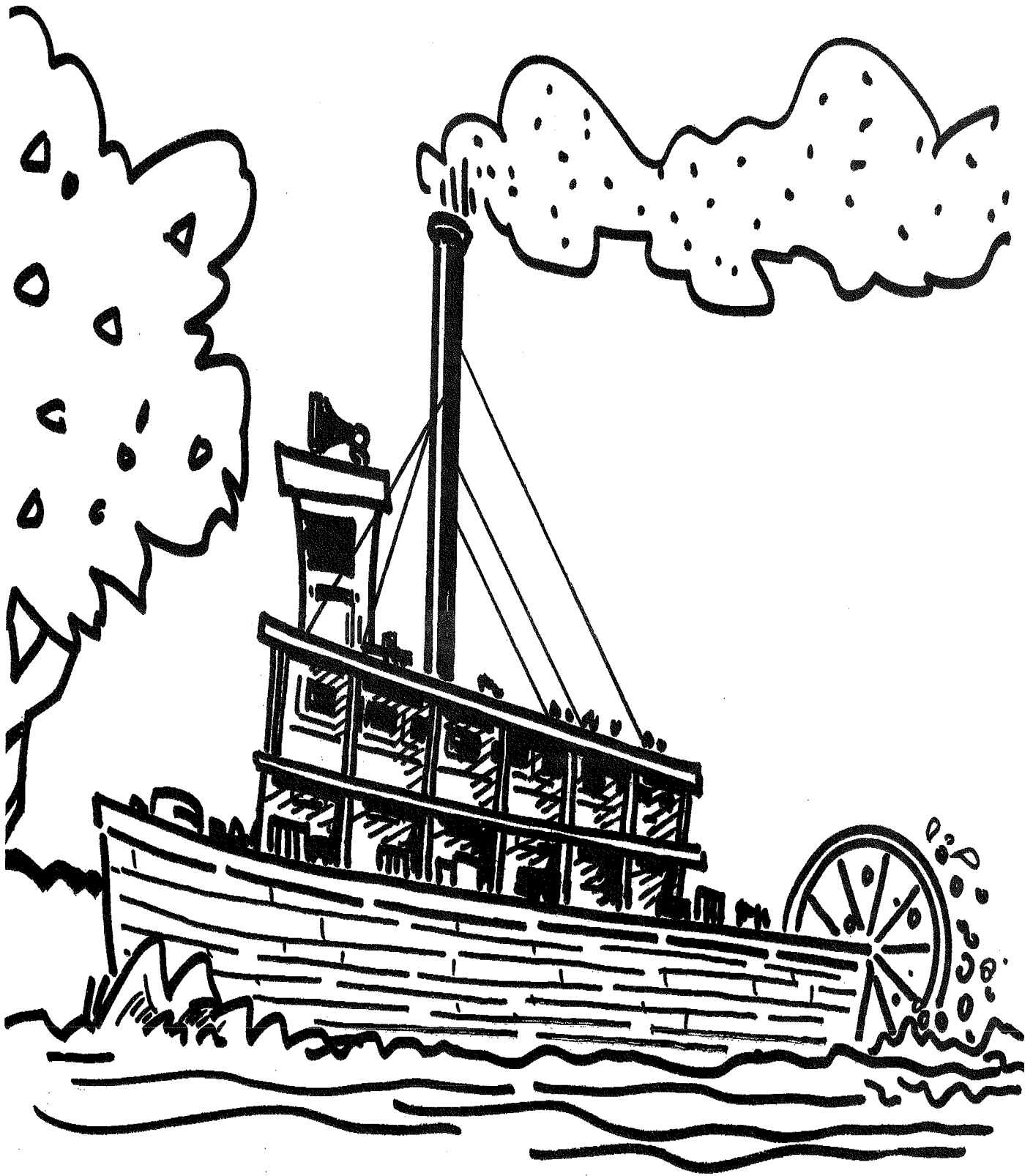

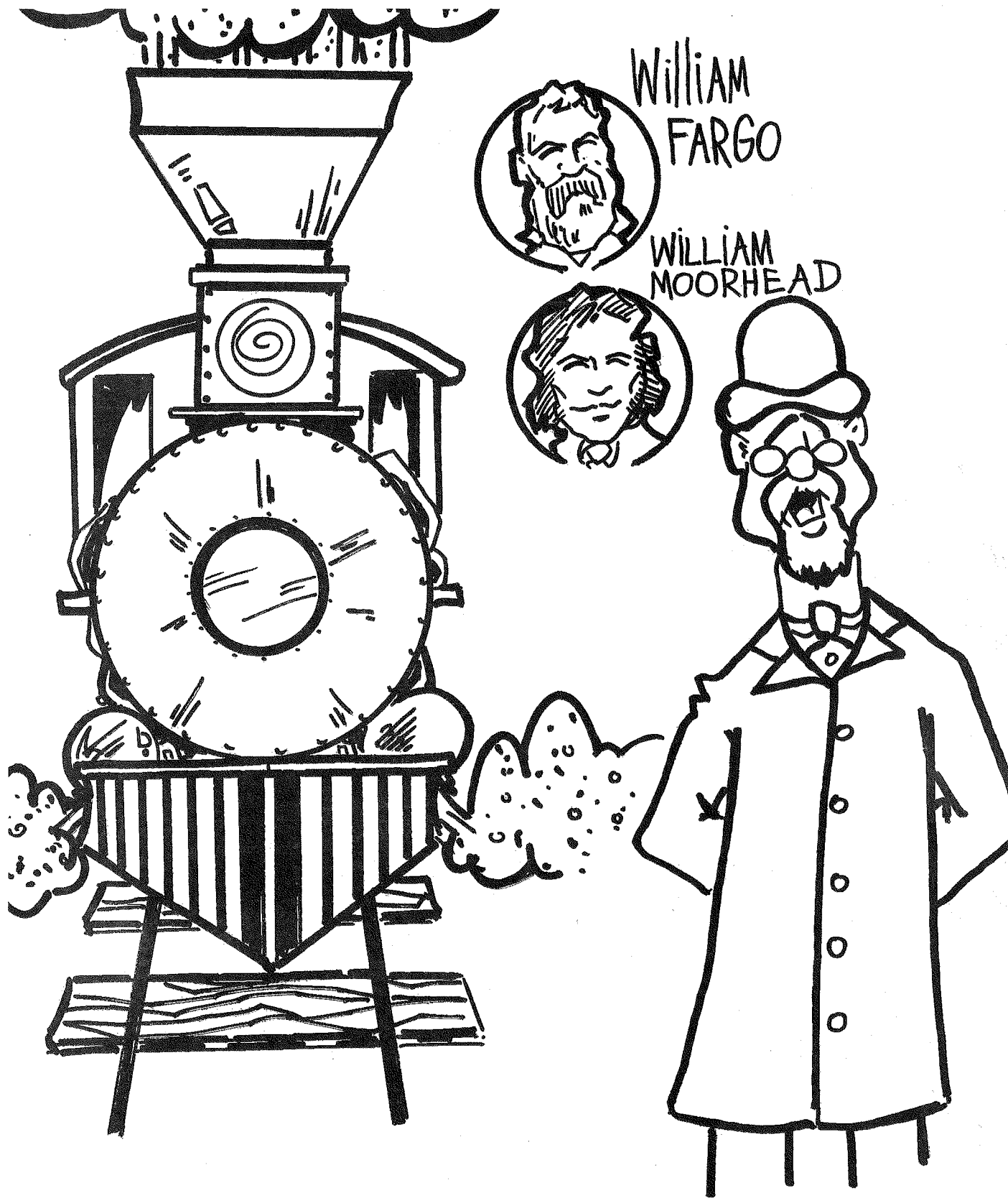
"Hawkeye" is the mascot of the FM RedHawks professional baseball team.



Ox Carts played an important role in the settling of the land.



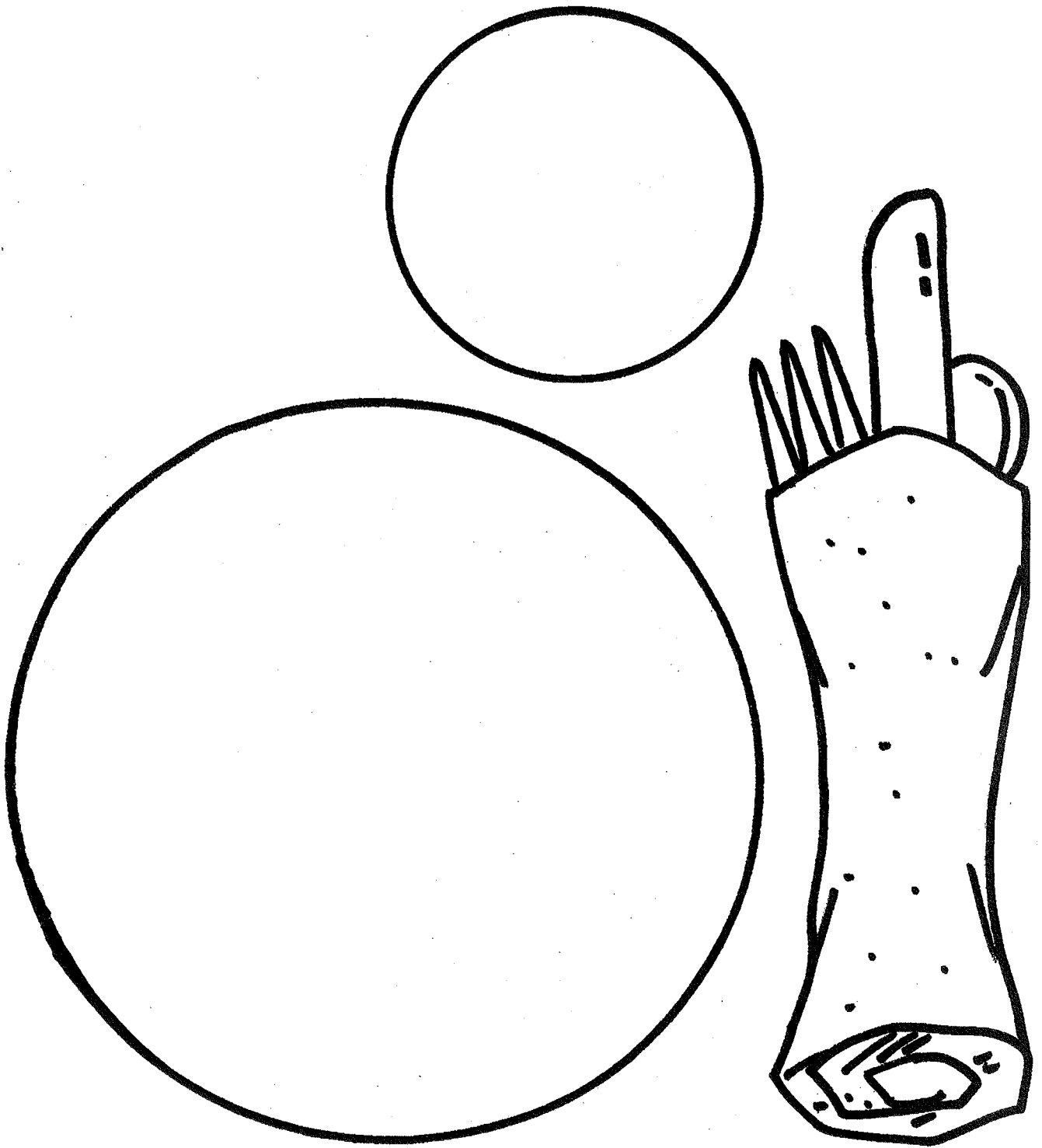
Steamboats were one of the first ways to travel on the Red River in the 1800's.

A statue in Fargo celebrates history's great Viking King.



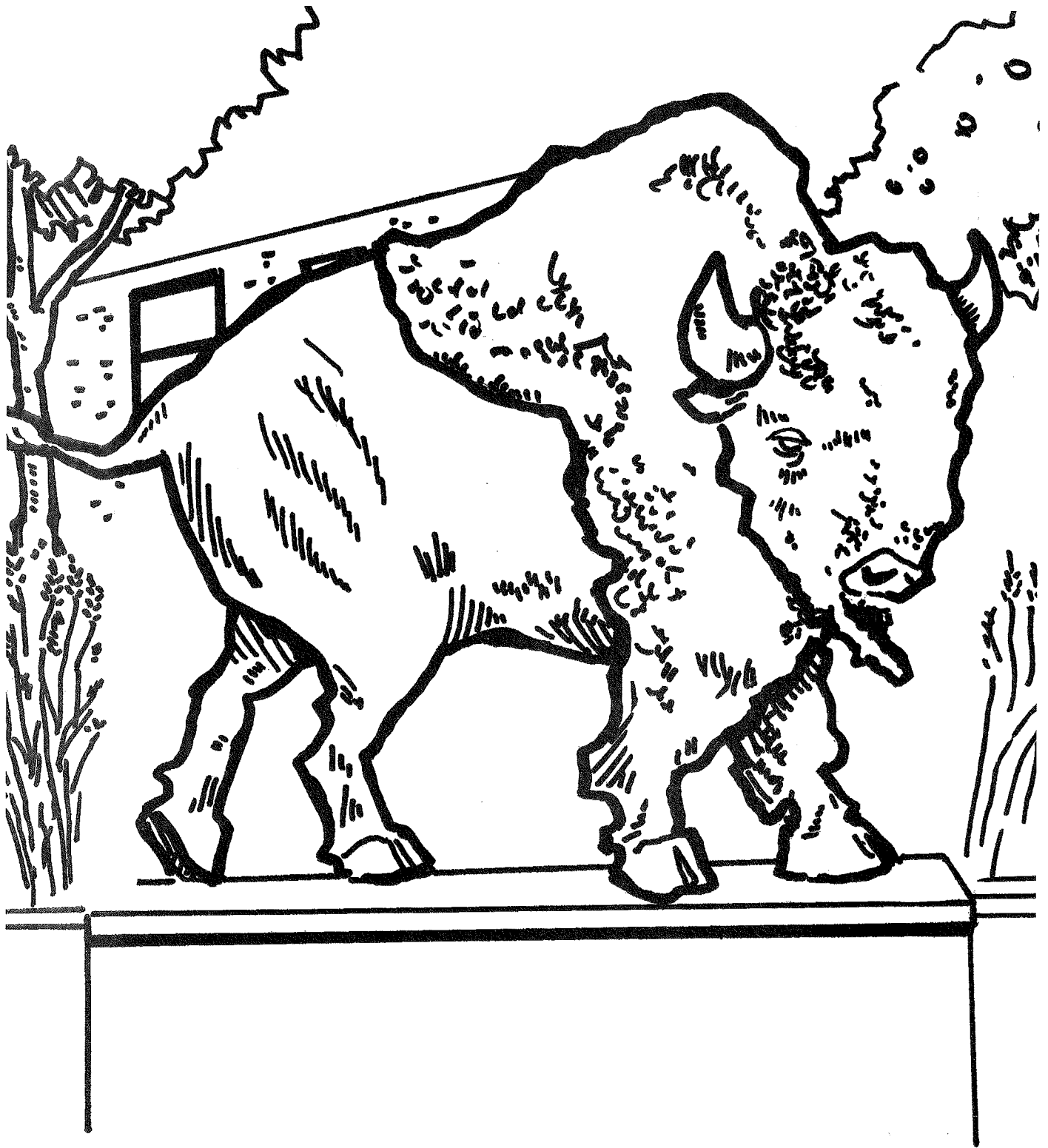

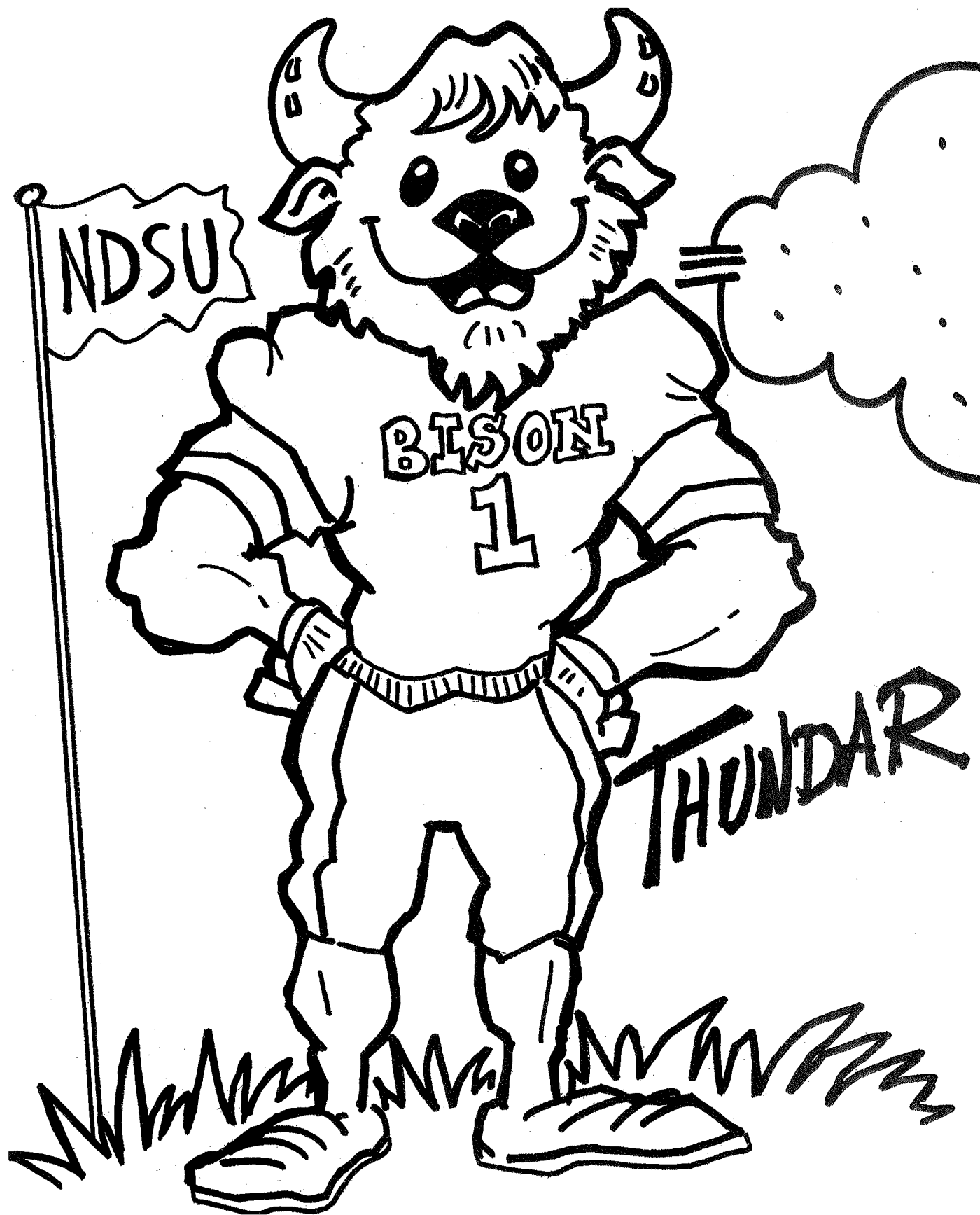

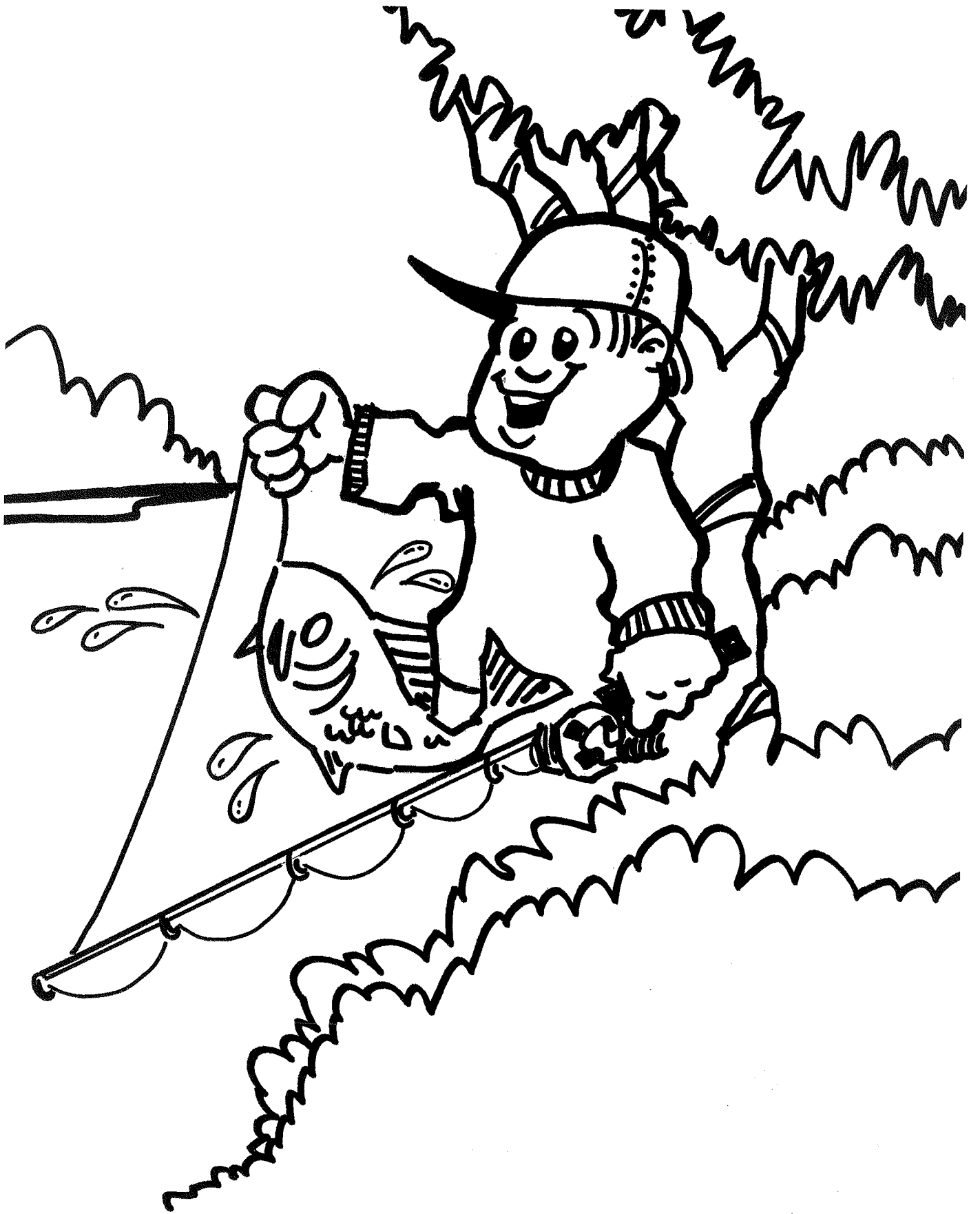

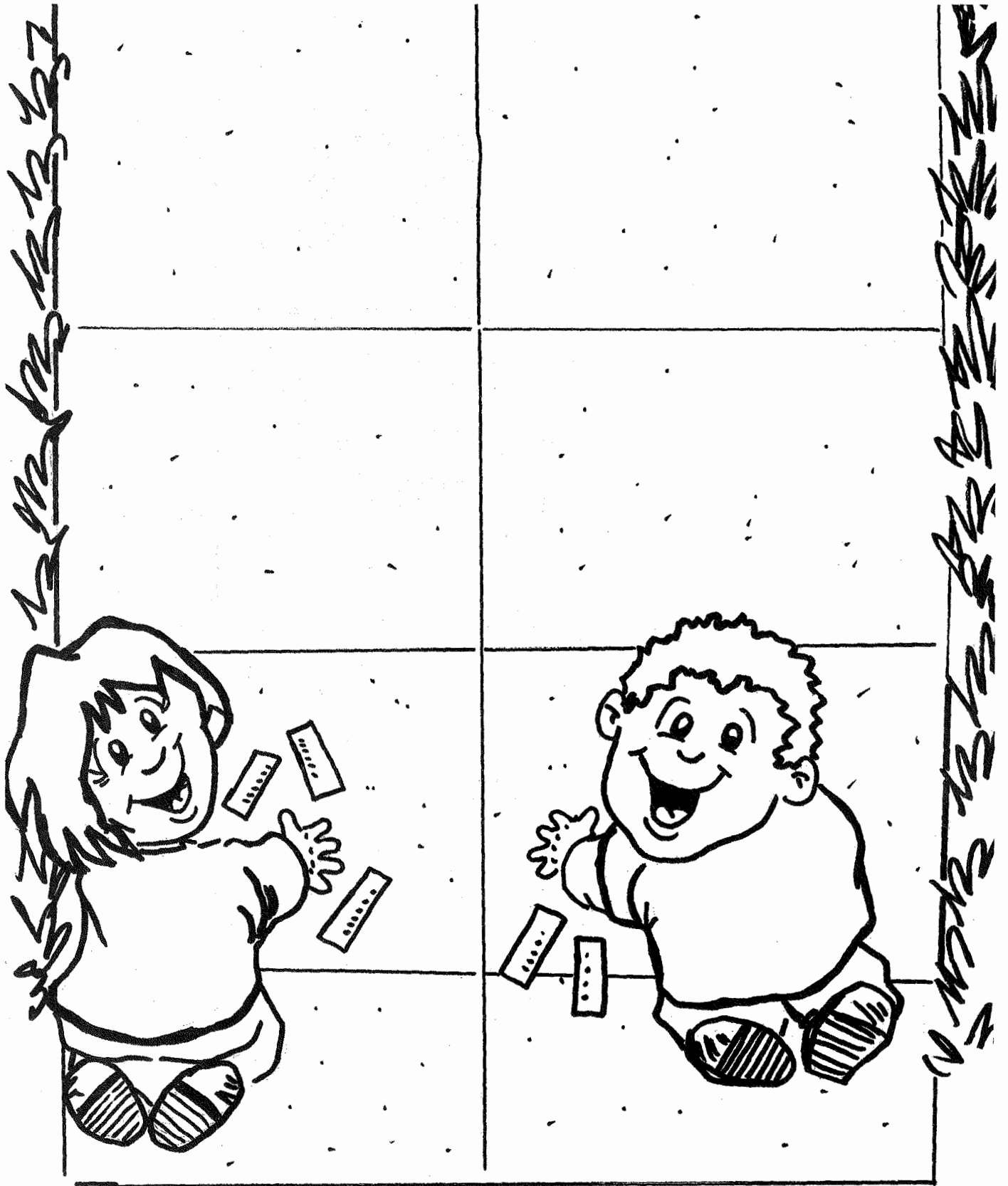
