Use this guide for correct format of Department, Course No., CRN/Course ID/Class Number, Credit

Example: an accounting class

**In Bold - letter/number format in the respective course schedule**

*In italics - how the column is labeled in the respective course schedule*

	<b>Department<sup>1</sup></b>	<b>Course No.<sup>2</sup></b>	<b>Course Title</b>	<b>CRN/Course ID/Class Number<sup>3</sup></b>	<b>Credit<sup>4</sup></b>
<b>Concordia</b>	<b>ACCT</b> <i>(Subj)</i>	<b>255</b> <i>(Crse:3 digit #)</i>	Self-explanatory	<b>18304</b> <i>(CRN: 5 digit #)</i>	<b>3</b> <i>(Cred)</i>
<b>M State</b>	<b>ACCT</b> <i>(Subj)</i>	<b>1101</b> <i>(4 digit #)</i>	Self-explanatory	<b>000271</b> <i>(SrsID, 6 digit #)</i>	<b>3</b> <i>(C)</i>
<b>MSUM</b>	<b>ACCT</b> <i>(Subj)</i>	<b>230</b> <i>(# - 3 digit #)</i>	Self-explanatory	<b>001111</b> <i>(ID #, 6 digit #)</i>	<b>3</b> <i>(Cr/Hr)</i>
<b>NDSU</b>	<b>ACCT</b> <i>(3-4 ltr Code)</i>	<b>200</b> <i>(# - 3 digit #)</i>	Self-explanatory	<b>4698</b> <i>(Class Nbr, 4 digit)</i>	<b>3</b> <i>(Units)</i>

<sup>1</sup> Always 3 or 4 letter code

<sup>2</sup> Always 3 or 4 numbers

<sup>3</sup> Varies between 4 and 6 numbers

<sup>4</sup> If you are taking a variable credit class, make sure to indicate the correct number.
